I am pleased to present three student notes from my hardworking colleagues, Emely Garcia, who importantly analyzes and critiques lending practices for student athletes, Jordan Regine, who proposes a light touch regulatory approach for on-orbit services, and Kurt Prang, who raises a timely discussion of the ways that business method patents may advance developments in blockchain innovation.

It is only through the hard work of our Board and dedicated members and the enthusiasm and support of our

faculty advisors, the Silicon Flatirons team, and Colorado Law staff that this Issue is possible. In particular, Lead Articles Editor Shelby Dolen volunteered countless hours to make this Issue as great as possible.
